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What is Take Me Home?

- ▶ Program designed to assist Law Enforcement during contacts with members of the community who have physical or mental challenges or disabilities or medical conditions.



- ▶ The registry allows Law Enforcement quick access to critical information about a registered person with special needs.
- ▶ The registry can provide emergency contact information, detailed physical descriptions, known routines, favorite attractions, vehicle information, and special needs of the one registered.

How it works

- ▶ If Law Enforcement finds someone who can't communicate where he/she lives, they can search a database by description or photo and locate where the individual belongs.
- ▶ The system also works in reverse – if a loved one goes missing or wanders away, his or her picture and description is immediately available to help with the search.
- ▶ Only Law Enforcement can access the Take Me Home database


Goal of the program
